

MOVING TRUCKS IN PUBLIC SPACE

I want to: Park a moving truck on the street in front of my residence.

Do I need a permit? Yes, a public space permit is required. If Emergency No Parking signs are needed, they will be provided with the permit.

Do I still need a permit if I don't use the street?

Possibly yes. Parking in an alley also requires a permit and driving across or blocking a sidewalk with a moving truck is prohibited.

I live on a busy street – is that a problem?

Moving trucks may only be parked in legal parking spaces and not in violation of posted rush-hour or street sweeping restrictions.

Where do I go for my permit and Emergency No Parking signs?

1100 4th Street, SW, Second Floor, between the hours of 8:30 am and 4:15 pm, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. On Thursday the hours are from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm. An electronic kiosk is currently available to assist with completion of an on-line application.

- How much will this cost? The permit fee is \$34. If applicable, there will be an additional fee for parking meters. Checks or money orders should be made payable to "DC Treasurer." Discover, MasterCard and Visa are accepted.
- *How long will it take?* Please allow approximately 2 hours, however, as the capabilities of the public space permit kiosks and on-line permitting are expanded, the time will be less.

How long will the Permit be effective?

Permits will be issued for no longer than 2 days, however, a permit may be issued weeks in advance of the permit effective start date.

What do I need to bring with me to apply for my public space application?

- Bring a complete Public Space Application which you can complete an on-line application at the Permit Office kiosk
- If applicable, the meter numbers for any parking meters to be taken out of service.

What will happen when I submit these materials to the Public Space Permit Office?

Staff from the permit office will review the application and ensure that the location is appropriate for a moving truck. Upon payment of all applicable fees a permit and Emergency No Parking signs will be issued.

When should the Emergency No Parking Signs be posted?

Emergency No Parking signs must be posted 72 hours prior to the arrival of the moving truck to be enforceable.
